

# DAY1 Dublin



The city was founded in about AD 71 when the 5,000 men of the Ninth Legion marched from Lincoln and set up camp. Eboracum, as the Romans called York, was born. In the 19th century York became a hub of the railway network and a confectionery manufacturing centre. In recent decades, the economy of York has moved from being dominated by its confectionery and railway-related industries to one that provides services. There are many historic places for you to see in York including Clifford's Tower which stands as a proud symbol of the power of England's medieval kings. Originally built by William the Conqueror to subdue the rebels of the north, it was twice burned to the ground, before being rebuilt by Henry III in the 13th century. The tower takes its name from one grisly incident in its long history, when Roger de Clifford was executed for treason against Edward II and hanged in chains from the tower walls. With sweeping panoramic views of York and the surrounding countryside, it isn't hard to see why Clifford's Tower played such a crucial role in the control of northern England. Overnight at the hotel















# DAY 7 York

Another chance to see the sights of this historic city awaits you today. There are many wonderful places to visit including the Yorvik Centre which tells the history of the Roman beginnings of the city. You could spend some time visiting the National Railway Museum where you can see over 300 years of locomotive history under one roof with giant halls full of trains including the majestic Duchess of Hamilton, the futuristic Japanese Bullet Train or marvel at the stunning opulence of the Royal Trains. Another lovely place to visit is the magnificent York Minster, which dominates the city skyline. This impressive building had been completed after 250 years of work and is crowned with the stunning tower which can be climbed for those who are brave enough. The Tower weighs 16,000 tonnes – about the same as 40 jumbo jets and has 275 steps to the top. On the way you pass the Minster's medieval pinnacles and gargoyles before reaching the stunning views over the city and the ancient streets below. In the afternoon you could stop for a bite to eat in Betty's Tearoom which is a must for any one visiting the city. Enjoy a bite to eat and a cup of tea before tucking in to the mouth watering cakes. Overnight at the hotel

# DAY 8 York

Today you would have the chance to visit the beautiful Yorkshire Dales with it beautiful scenery and pretty villages. You could visit Aysgarth Waterfalls which were features in the film Robin Hood Prince of Thieves where Robin first met the outlaws and fought Little John. You could also visit the Wensleysdale Cheese factory where the world famous cheese is made and enjoy lunch, which mostly involves cheese, in the lovely restaurant. The rest of the day could be spent exploring the beautiful scenery and the wonderful views from the top of the hill which, in places, stretch in to the neighbouring counties. Overnight at the hotel

# DAY 1 London

Welcome to England. After landing our driver would be waiting at arrivals to assist you before transferring you to your hotel. Founded by William the Conqueror in 1066-7 and enlarged by successive sovereigns, the Tower of London is one of the world's most famous and spectacular fortresses. Over the past 1000 years it has been a Royal Palace, an armoury and a place of imprisonment and execution. The Beefeaters who guard the Tower will regale you with stories of its past. You also visit the Crown Jewels, including the magnificent solid-gold crown used at the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, the enormous Cullinan diamonds and the extraordinary Koh-i-Noor. Overnight at the hotel



# DAY 4 London

Today you do something a little out of the ordinary and visit some of London's well known markets, many of which have been in existence for over a hundred years. You would be able to delve into the world of the real Londoners many of whom have worked the markets for generation handing stalls down through the families for decades. These are a treasure trove of tradition and were always a place for the inhabitants of London to buy everything they could possibly need from fruit, veg and meat to the famous fish and flower markets. You can see and try authentic foods from all around the world which are enjoyed by the millions of people who make up the multination population of London. The markets are also a wonderful place to visit for anyone who is interested in vintage cloths and arts and crafts including painting, embroidery and knitting to name a few. There are various markets for you to choose from to visit including famous ones such as Portobello Road, a world famous market selling antiques, jewellery, vintage cloths and bric-a-brac, Covent Garden, in the Market Hall where you can peruse the various stalls consisting of every kind of arts and crafts imaginable and Camden Lock which specialises in arts and crafts, jewellery, vintage clothing and food stalls. Leaving Bath behind the tour continues to Lacock, a little known picturesque village dating back to the Saxon era. Many of the beautiful buildings originally formed part of an extensive monastic complex and are now owned by The National Trust. So pretty is the village that it has provided the setting for many movies and television dramas including Jane Austen's Pride and Prejudice and more recently Harry Potter and the Philosophers Stone. You could enjoy a delightful walk before an





early evening supper in The George Inn (supper not included), a vintage pub built in 1361. The final destination for the day is the mysterious Stonehenge which has been baffling scholars and scientists for thousands of years. Built nearly 5,000 years ago, Stonehenge is the most popular prehistoric monument in the world even pre dating the ancient Pyramids of Giza. Most visitors are unable to access the stones but your tour will allow you this rare privilege with a close up viewing of the mysterious monoliths as you enter the stone circle its self and stand beside the mighty Sarsen rocks towering above you. Your guide will explain the history of this ancient site, pointing out the alter, slaughter and heel stones above which the sun rises dramatically on the Summer Solstice. You will have time to enjoy the peace, away from the crowds as you experience Stonehenge at its mysterious best. Overnight at the hotel

## London

Another days sightseeing awaits you today, this time taking you to visit Kent also known as the Garden of England. The central 'Bell Harry Tower' dates back to 1498, and the crypt to the 11th Century. It is here where your guide will tell the story of the shocking murder of Archbishop Thomas Beckett in 1170 and there will also be time to explore the narrow streets of Canterbury. The final destination for the days tour, before heading back to London, is the seaside town of Dover and the magnificent White Cliffs made famous in the famous WWII song. ## Wicklow Tour














# Kilkenny Tour

Four star rating usually portraits a very comfortable, with good facilities and good level of service, accommodation. There are large and attractive public areas, bars and often a restaurant. However, in some small hotels, the four stars rating is purely an indication of comfort and good service. They are the ideal choice for "special" occasions, and a frequent choice for business travellers. Five star rating indicates a luxurious accommodation, with extensive public areas and very attentive service.

Five star (+) Superior and above indicate outstanding accommodation that offers all possible facilities and amenities with tremendous service, luxurious surroundings and normally demand a high price tag.

Twin and double room issues. Since hotels often have many more twin rooms than doubles, they might occasionally allocate a twin even though a double room is reserved. If a double bed is of paramount importance for the booking, we suggest that you advise us of this using the remarks section and we will ensure that this is communicated directly to the hotel's reservation team. In many destinations and properties, all double rooms are made up of two single beds pushed together and made up as a double bed. Twin rooms may contain two single beds or one single bed and a rollaway.

Triple and quadruple rooms. A triple room usually comprises one double bed plus a single bed, or three separate beds. Single beds may be foldable or rollaway beds. A quadruple room has same layout as that of a triple room with an extra foldable or rollaway bed. Either configuration may result in a room of restricted space. A family room may be a better choice in some properties as their layout is specifically designed with extra space in mind.

A payment deadline is always clearly displayed at the time of booking and should be respected by both parties. A written confirmation by GBDMC is required wherever the deadline cannot be honoured by our clients.

Our website prices may vary due to a fluid pricing model based on participation and availability, world currencies fluctuations, significant world developments or government action. However, such variations can only apply to future bookings. Once a booking is made, its price is fixed. Despite our best efforts, at times, an error may result in a price or other details of a service or services being displayed or presented within our website, incorrectly. In such a case we reserve the right to cancel that service only. You will be notified in such a case and if a payment has already been taken, and you will be fully refunded the amount for that service only although any other services that might have been booked will be honoured. When we are notified of, or discover, an error or omission we will do our best to correct it as soon as is practicable.

Cancellations. All hotels have their own cancellation policies and you will be liable to pay any cancellation charges that the hotel may levy. In most cases, these charges are equivalent to the first night of the stay when cancellation is later than 48 hours prior to the guest's arrival in the hotel. If any further charges are applicable, these will be advised at the time of booking. Similar charges will apply to a non-show, or an early curtailment of the guest's stay. For practical reasons, 48 hours means by 1700 hrs (UK time) two days before arrival. For group bookings as well as all other ground services such as attraction tickets, tours, entrance fees, car hire, catering and transfers, similar cancellation charges may apply. Such charges will be made known to the user at the time of the original booking. Cancellations outside our office hours should be sent by e-mail direct to the hotel with a copy attached to GBDMC as well. The hotel and GBDMC reserve the right to cancel any bookings that we suspect, with good reason, to be fraudulent.

Any potential required changes to the duration of the stay or room allocations prior the guest's arrival should only be arranged through GBDMC and not the hotel directly.

Children Discounts. Infants under two years are accommodated free of charge in a cot, unless otherwise advised at the time of booking. Pricing policies for children may vary from one hotel to another. Children between two and twelve years who may be free of charge in accommodation terms may still be charged on board supplements. Any child discount received often applies to the board supplement as well, unless it is specifically stated that it is on terms only. Children aged 12 and over are normally charged as adults unless otherwise indicated at the time of booking.

GBDMC must be advised of any children under the age of 18 planning to travel alone (or with similar aged friends) prior to booking, and such arrangement must be additionally agreed by the hotel, before the reservation can be fully confirmed. Failure to notify the hotel in advance, may lead to children under the age of 18 without an accompanying adult being refused accommodation.

In the very unlikely event that the hotelier cannot provide the booked accommodation, our client accepts that the hotelier's responsibility is limited to finding an alternative of a similar standard and to providing transportation as appropriate to this property. GBDMC takes every reasonable precaution to select hotels that are professionally managed so that any such occurrence is exceptionally rare. Our client also accepts that early notification of such a change cannot be guaranteed. GBDMC shall have no liability in respect of any costs, losses or damages existing out of or in connection with a relocation of accommodation, since such relocation is outside of GBDMC's control. Should our client reject a satisfactory alternative, this is at their own risk.














